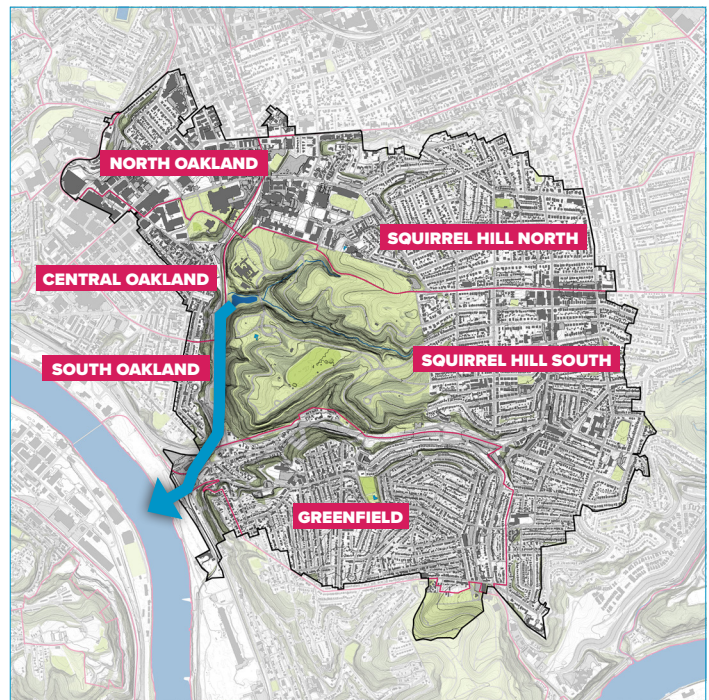
# You're Invited!

## Learn about the Four Mile Run Green Stormwater Infrastructure Project!

### About the Project

The Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority is rebuilding Pittsburgh's stormwater management system to ensure strong, safe, flood-prepared neighborhoods. This project will daylight and restore Four Mile Run from Panther Hollow Lake to the Monongahela River to prevent Combined Sewer Overflows (CSOs) and reduce neighborhood flooding. The project includes restoration of ecology and recreation uses of Panther Hollow Lake and existing streams, as well as an improved Junction Hollow Trail. This project also sets the stage for green stormwater infrastructure throughout the M29 sewershed that will reduce the amount of stormwater entering the combined sewer system and improve quality of life in six City neighborhoods.

We encourage you to attend this important meeting to learn about the project. We'll provide an update on the design and listen to your concerns and ideas on the proposed improvements.
